## Our speaker will be Justin Estreicher, his presentation:

Impossible...to Read the Past History of North America: Archaeology and the Denial of Indigenous Heritage, 1876–1906

In the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, the anxieties of modern industrial life bred a nostalgic culture in the United States. Though white Americans in this period often looked to an idealized Indian as a symbol of an imagined past, they routinely denied living Native people's ability to remember or recapture the glories of the indigenous past on their own. In this talk, Justin Estreicher, Ph.D. candidate in history, will consider the role of archaeology—as practiced by "professionals," popularized by profit-seekers, and promoted by politicians—in reinforcing a racialized view that Euro-Americans were uniquely capable of transcending the arrow of time and rediscovering a glorious past that eluded indigenous people. From World's Fair exhibits to the creation of national monuments in the West, the treatment of American antiquity was informed by the impulse to divorce living Natives from the achievements of their ancestors. Understanding the roots of this idea will allow us to consider whether the racial thinking of the nineteenth century remains with us and chart a future for archaeology and historic preservation that is more inclusive of Native people's stories.

Justin Estreicher is a Ph.D. student (ABD)...All But Dissertation, at The College of William & Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia. Justin is also the recipient this year of the LA Corral's Autry Fellowship.
