Fifty years have passed since Abe Hoffman became a member of the Los Angeles Corral. In the decades that followed, he has attended more than 600 Corral meetings, not counting Fandango and Rendezvous events.

His presentation discusses some of the best (and worst) meetings he attended, the lifelong friendships, the evolution of Corral membership to include women as full-fledged members, and other highlights he experienced over his five decades of Corral membership. The presentation gives a hint of what will be found in the forthcoming Corral Keepsake.
