"Lost in the Sixties: Coming of Age in Hippie San Francisco"

Brian Dervin Dillon, Ph.D.

San Francisco, California, was the epicenter of the Hippie explosion of music and art between 1965 and 1970. Present-day historians who weren't there often incorrectly explain Hippies in political terms: those of us who were there explain ourselves culturally instead. As the rest of the country sank inexorably into the morass of Vietnam, in San Francisco we pushed the limits of personal expression and escapism. Nowhere else on the planet was more live music played by a greater number of musicians in more places than in the City by the Bay during the second half of the 'sixties decade. What we developed during those five years attracted first national, then international attention. If you were in a rock n roll, or blues, or soul band and you were not playing in San Francisco, then you were nowhere.

Brian Dervin Dillon, a 5th-generation Marin County boy, was one of the youngest home-grown Hippies of the San Francisco Bay Area. He saw the whole cultural experiment coming long before anybody was ever called a Hippie. Brian was an active participant before, during, and after the Hippie high tide, San Francisco's so-called 1967 "Summer of Love." Dillon's lavishly illustrated lecture, the 15th he has presented to the Los Angeles Corral, explores Hippie antecedents and traces the birth, florescence, and eventual death of Hippie culture, focusing upon the music and poster art that were its most remarkable and enduring hallmarks. Brian was the 2017 Sheriff of the Los Angeles Corral, and is the newest Living Legend (2025) of Westerners International.
